

Redemption: God's Promise

"Behold, I will do a <u>new thing</u>; now shall it spring forth; shall ye not know it? I will even make a way in the wilderness, and rivers in the desert." (Isaiah 43:19)

His head and his hairs were white like wool, as white as snow; and his eyes were as a flame of fire; And his feet like unto fine brass, as if they burned in a furnace, and his voice as the sound of many waters. (Revelation 1:14-15)

"Lamb of God," or "the Sacrificial Lamb:

- Without sin
- Without blemish

- Brass = Judgement, Just (True)
- Defeated death (satan)

"Come now, and **let us reason together**," says the LORD. "Though your sins are like scarlet, They shall be as **white as snow**; Though they are <u>red like crimson</u>, They shall be **as wool**." (Isaiah 1:18)

Your sins are visible, cannot be hidden. Your transgression causes separation from God because he is Holy.

"Let us reason together," says the LORD.



A heart (will) of repentance, accepting God's invitation to be reconciled, to seek and come back into a relationship with Him.



"The words of the LORD are pure words: as silver tried in a furnace of earth, purified seven times." (Psalm 12:6)

PURE

God's <u>words</u> are true and faithful, unwavering, withstanding and will not fall; and will not change. Jesus who was God in the flesh, committed to the cross unto death. His word to the world, from the old testament to new testament, to people who will accept his invitation of salvation, will make us clean again (restore us). To bring us back into a relationship with Him once more and forever.

Can you see the promise of redemption from the old testament to the new? God told His creation how He wanted to bring them back unto Him again. His word was persistent, and it did not fail. Jesus's last words before giving up His spirit was "It is finished," a promise (words) sealed and complete.
